Pronunciation of final “-ed” Simple Past Tense The final -ed ending has three different pronunciations: /t/, /d/, and /ed/ Final - ed is pronounced after /t/ all voiceless sounds Voiceless sounds are made by pushing air through your mouth; no sound comes from your throat

How to learn English pronunciation 1 Learn the sounds of English English uses different sounds than other languages For example, the first sound in the word thin and the first sound in the word away are never spoken in many languages So you have to know all the English sounds

Accent Rules: Word ends in a consonant (except n or s): Accent is on the last syllable, as in “hospital”, “general” Word ends in a vowel (or n, s) Accent is on the next to last syllable, as in “ca sa, pe rros, niños” Exceptions have accent mark , as in lápiz
